Pastor's Reflection

How many breaths have you taken today?

I'll admit—I've never counted. Yet last week, while traveling across the open plains of North Dakota and Montana I had plenty of time to read, and was astonished to learn that the average human takes 23,040 breaths each day.

With more than 7.5 billion of us on the planet, that is a lot of breathing. And where does all of that oxygen come from? While some emerges from trees and other land plants, most comes to us from ocean plants. In fact, one out of every five breaths that you will take today is dependent on oxygen freely given by phytoplankton.

While fireworks fill the skies and celebrations of "independence" abound, I am reminded of a deeper story---the story of our connection to the precious and fragile web of life woven by our gracious God. As I breathe, I re-member that we are not isolated, self-made individuals. We are vulnerable creatures, not the Creator--dependent on the sacred gifts of God to fill our bellies, quench our thirst and sustain the beating of our hearts.

I give thanks for the web of connection in this community of faith and pray that your summer celebrations might be filled with joy, deep breaths, and

daily reminders of our holy *inter*dependence on the gifts of God.


Barb enjoys going on long walks with her dog, Frank. She enjoys cooking, especially Italian.


